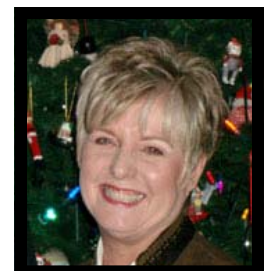

The day your CWPP angels delivered 70 sets of bath towels, hand towels and wash cloths, 65 pillows, 20 mattress pads, and 4 pairs of pajamas, we thought it was Christmas! To receive \$3,040 worth of linens was a gift of gifts.

Later that day, Krystal and her two children arrived to move into the safe and nurturing environment of The Thunderbirds Family Village. They had fled Pennsylvania and a life of physical, emotional and financial abuse at the hands of their husband and father. Krystal arrived with a black eye and four broken ribs, the children arrived with broken hearts and much damaged spirits. Imagine their delight when they went to sleep that night on new sheets, covered with comfy, cozy blankets, and with their heads resting on new pillows. Your gift played a role within 12 hours of delivery.
